



# Horseshoe Bend School District

## March 12, 2019 Supplemental Levy Election

### Questions and Answers

#### **Q. Why does the district need a supplemental levy?**

**A.** While state funding for schools has increased recently, it has only been after a steady decline beginning in 2008, forcing nearly every school district in Idaho to ask their patrons to support supplemental levies. In 2008, state support for our school was \$2.13 million. In 2018, ten years later, state support for our school is \$1.98 million. Additionally, the new public school funding formula, if passed by the legislature in its current form, will result in a 3.8% DECREASE in state funding for our school.

#### **Q. What is the amount of the supplemental levy, and how will it impact my property tax bill?**

**A.** The levy would generate up to \$300,000 per year for each of the next two years (the 2019-20 and 2020-21 school years). The annual cost of the supplemental levy to the taxpayer will be \$238 per \$100,000 of taxable value (this is a decrease from \$260 for the current levy). With the 50% homeowner's exemption, and with a home valued at \$100,000, the annual cost would be \$119.

#### **Q. Will my property tax rate increase if the supplemental levy passes?**

**A.** No. Your tax rate will not increase as this is a replacement of the current supplemental levy. In fact, the overall tax levy rate which includes tort, construction bond (CTE Building), and supplemental levy will decrease as we will be lowering the rate levied on the construction bond.

#### **Q. How will the money be used?**

**A.** The levy money will be used to:

- Maintain current staffing and programs
- Improve campus safety and security
- Provide curriculum and materials for students
- Maintain/improve buildings and facilities
- Provide technology and technology upgrades
- Fund athletics

#### **Q. How was the money spent from the current supplemental levy that expires on June 30, 2019?**

**A.** Thanks to the soon-to-be-expired supplemental levy, we have been able to:

- Fund preschool
- Keep full-day kindergarten
- Fully fund athletics
- Hire a Student Resource Officer
- Fund the mini-house project
- Maintain current teaching staff
- Create a Community School
- Hire additional paraprofessionals
- Purchase a new school bus
- Increase class offerings in middle/high school
- Replace antiquated HVAC systems
- Purchase mobile computer labs
- Purchase an electronic sign
- Maintain a state required contingency fund

#### **Q. Have my tax dollars resulted in overall school improvement?**

**A.** Our school is improving every year, and some of our notable achievements include:

- Horseshoe Bend Elementary being recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School for Exemplary High Performance
- Multiple college credits earned by our high school students
- Graduates attending college at a rate higher than the state average
- Increased test scores across the board
- Improved financial practices resulting in greater accountability and a positive fund balance

### **Registration**

- You can now register to vote online at <https://apps.idahovotes.gov/OnlineVoterRegistration>
- If you would rather not register online, you can register to vote on Election Day (March 12) at the polling location, and you will need to bring a government-issued ID and proof of residency (power bill, phone bill, lease agreement, etc...)
- You can also send in a completed voter registration form with your absentee ballot request form as long as it is postmarked 25 days prior to the March 12 election
